**Better Newspaper  
Contest**

*The Kansas City Star* and *Missouri Lawyers Weekly* were awarded this year's Gold Cups by the Missouri Press Foundation. Both of the newspapers repeated their Gold Cup wins from 2009.

Award winners in the Foundation's annual Better Newspaper Contest were announced Saturday (Oct. 16) during the 144th annual Missouri Press Association Convention. The meeting was held at The Lodge of Four Seasons, Lake Ozark.

The contest recognizes excellence in news, feature and column writing, editorials, design, advertising, photography and other newspaper skills. Members of the Iowa Newspaper Association judged this year's contest.

Missouri Press Foundation is the educational and philanthropic affiliate of the Missouri Press Association, the newspaper organization based in Columbia.

A point system for the annual contest emphasizes general excellence, community service and investigative reporting. Each award won by a newspaper has point value. Gold Cups are awarded to the daily and weekly newspapers that accumulate the most points in the contest.
