Featured Speakers



Bryna Krauth has spent much of the last 15 years working in the media industry. She specializes in developing marketing strategies for revenue growth across mediums like newspapers, magazines, television and the Internet. She was also the president and part-owner of PRWatchdog, an online reputation management and social media marketing company. In addition, she ran an online recruitment company and several recruitment verticals for CEO Ventures headquartered in Atlanta, GA.

Bryna began her career in the media industry in 1994. Most recently, she was the publisher of Steamboat Pilot & Today, Steamboat Today, and Hayden Valley Press. In addition, she was the publisher of numerous magazines and Web sites including Yampa Valley Real Estate, At Home in Steamboat, Colorado Hunter, steamboatpilot.com and exploresteamboat.com. She has worked and lived in Northwest Colorado since December, 1996, and during that time specialized in implementing new revenue generating products for the news organization and leading a team of advertising consultants. She has held nearly every management position in the newspaper business and was also the publisher of the Craig Daily Press, in Craig, CO. She is a past member of the board of directors for the Colorado Press Association.



Paul Steinle is a veteran journalist and news media manager who has been teaching journalism since 1991. He launched graduate journalism programs at the University of Miami and Quinnipiac University. Since 2001 he has taught journalism and subsequently served as associate provost at Southern Oregon University in Ashland, Ore. From 1995-2000, Steinle served as president of the Sigma Delta Chi Foundation.

Previously, Steinle had a 29-year career as a professional reporter and news manager. He was the president of UPI and the Financial News Network; he was a TV news director at KING-TV in Seattle; and he reported from Saigon and Hong Kong for Group–W news. Steinle has an M.B.A. from Harvard and an M.S. from Syracuse University.



Max Heath is a semi-retired postal consultant for Publishing Group of America (American Profile/Relish/Spry), and for Landmark Community Newspapers Inc., Shelbyville, KY, a division of Landmark Communications, Norfolk, VA. For 21 years he was executive editor and for 23 years corporate circulation director as well. He writes a monthly Postal Tips column for Publishers' Auxiliary. He was named to the Postal Service Mailer's Technical Advisory Committee, representing the National Newspaper Association, in 1989 and is also on the national Periodical Operations Advisory Committee, and the rulemaking Periodicals Advisory Group. He received the NNA President's Award in 1989 and 1997, Ambassador Award in 1992, and coveted Amos Award for service to NNA in 1994, and President's Award in 2007. The Postal Service presented him a Special Achievement Award Sept. 2, 1998 at the National Postal Forum. He conducts seminars on "Maximizing Postal Savings and Delivery" for newspaper associations and groups as part of NNA's outreach to the industry. He is past NNA director for Region 3. He has served on many MTAC work groups to help shape rules that are useful for newspapers, or minimize any harm.



Rudi Keller is the politics and sta<mark>te g</mark>overnment reporter for the Columbia Daily Tribune. He worked for the Tribune for more than 12 years in the 1980s and 1990s, and was a reporter covering city government, business and politics at the Southeast Missourian from 2005 to 2010, when he returned to the Tribune. A native of Louisville, Ky., Keller graduated from the University of Missouri School of Journalism in 1986.
