The Missouri General Assembly convened at 12 noon Wednesday, Jan. 4, in Jefferson City. It will adjourn at 6 p.m. on Friday, May 18. Missouri Press Association has spotted some bills that MPA will be monitoring. (See list below.)

Missouri Press Association expects an active session, and publishers and newspaper staffers will be called upon to contact their senators and representatives on various issues. Grassroots contacts by MPA members are vital, or we will not prevail on issues important to the newspaper industry. SB 447 - Goodman - Adds mail to the list of types of property that, when stolen, increase the classification of the crimes of stealing and receiving stolen property to class C felonies (CRIME)

SB 451 - Cunningham - Establishes the "Sharing of Services and Increasing Efficiencies Act" to allow school districts and other entities to achieve efficiencies (PUBLIC NOTICES)

SB 467 - Munzlinger - Requires agencies that receive federal grants to track on their web sites and disclose the usage of the funds

SB 477 - Crowell - Modifies the state do-not-call list by allowing cell phone numbers on the list and banning certain automated calls

SB 729 – Schaefer – Modifies provisions relating to county purchases, increasing thresholds before bid notices are required in newspapers.

SJR 23 - Crowell - Proposes a constitutional amendment to create term limits for all statewide elected officials

SJR 24 - Crowell - Requires the joint election of the Governor and Lieutenant Governor beginning in the year 2016

SJR 25 - Crowell - Lowers the number of State Representatives from 163 to 101

SJR 26 - Lager - Proposes a constitutional amendment to create term limits for all statewide elected officials

Establishes the Employment Advertisement Fairness Act which prohibits a person or entity from including in a job advertisement certain statements requiring an applicant to be currently employed

HB 1327 - Cox, Stanley

Authorizes a public body to close certain foster care licensure data and requires the Children's Division to prepare a detailed report of specific information obtained in the licensure process HB 1344 - Nasheed, Jamilah

Authorizes a person to apply to a court for the expungement of certain criminal records

HB 1345 - Cauthorn, John

Allows the Secretary of State to enter into an agreement with a nonprofit organization to print and distribute the Official State Manual

HB 1356 - Funderburk, Doug

Requires the Director of the Department of Revenue to enter into the multistate Streamlined Sales and Use Tax Agreement and the department to implement the compliance provisions

HB 1484 - McCaherty, John

Authorizes the Department of Revenue to use technology to make processes for filing certain forms and sending certain notifications more efficient

HB 1544 - Kirkton, Jeanne

Requires a certificate of value to be filed with the assessor before the recorder of deeds can accept the filing of any document by which any interest in certain real property is conveyed HB 1553 - Hughes IV, Leonard

Authorizes a one-time expungement of certain criminal records including a conviction for any nonviolent crime, misdemeanor, or nonviolent drug violation

HB 1564 - Hummel, Jacob Specifies that any personal identifying information that is utilized in a voluntary registry of persons with health-related ailments to assist them during a disaster is not considered a public record

HB 1573 Schneider, Vicki

Changes myriad provisions relating to political subdivisions

HB 1615 - Oxford, Jeanette Mott Changes the laws regarding actions against a person for conduct or speech at a public hearing or meeting

HB 1622 - Jones, Caleb Establishes the criteria for advertisements for health care services

HB 1627 Jones, Caleb

Expands restrictions on the release of the home addresses or other information contained in department of revenue motor vehicle or driver registration records to include state and federal judges

HB 1634 - Ruzicka, Don Repeals Section 260.255 relating to the recycling of newspapers

HB 1645 - Fisher, Barney

Authorizes the expungement of certain misdemeanor offenses after a period of eight years

HB 1653 - Kelly, Chris

Proposes a constitutional amendment eliminating the prohibition on the use of public funds for the benefit of any religious or sectarian educational purpose
